The Purpose of Local Chapters

CBA local chapter's purpose is to fulfill the Mission Statement of CBA. They are a local ministry team reaching out in their community using bowhunting and archery as a touch point to share the Gospel and encourage Christian growth.

Requirements to Start a Local CBA Chapter

A minimum of four individuals are needed to start a chapter. These four individuals can serve as officers for the local chapter. All officers and voting members of the chapter must be CBA members in good standing. However, chapters may set additional requirements in areas other than those covered by Federal law or the CBA "Statement of Faith" as published in the individual membership application pamphlet.

Relationship to CBA

The relationship to CBA will be governed by the CBA bylaws and subject to the limitations of the CBA Board of Directors. All activities, meetings, shoots, hunts, and outreach projects will be solely up to the chapter. An annual report must be sent to the chapter coordinator to maintain the chapter charter.
